TESTI ESTRATTI

Following the European elections in May 2019, the EU set a number of priorities that shape the political and policy agenda until 2024. They serve to address the main challenges faced by the EU and EU nationals.

The priorities derive from a dialogue between EU leaders, national ministers, EU institutions and the political groups elected to the European Parliament.

The European Council set out 4 priority areas in its 2019-2024 strategic agenda to guide the work of the EU institutions over the next 5 years. These areas seek to respond to the challenges and opportunities that the current global situation has thrown up.

- Two of the four priority set out by the European Council in its 2019-2024 strategic agenda are:
 - Protecting citizens and freedoms

Ensuring effective control of the EU's external borders and further developing a comprehensive migration policy. Fighting terrorism and cross-border/online crime, increasing the EU's resilience against both natural and man-made disasters.

• Developing a strong economic base

Building a resilient economy by deepening the Economic and Monetary Union to ensure that Europe is better prepared for future shocks.

- One of the four priority set out by the European Council in its 2019-2024 strategic agenda is:
 - Building a climate-neutral, green, fair and social Europe

Investing in green initiatives that improve air and water quality, promote sustainable agriculture and preserve environmental systems and biodiversity. Creating an effective circular economy (where products are designed to be more durable, reusable, repairable, recyclable and energy-efficient) and a well-functioning EU energy market that provides sustainable, secure and affordable energy.

The EU's main economic engine is the single market. It enables most goods, services, money and people to move freely throughout most of the continent.

It has certainly become much easier to move around Europe – all EU citizens have the right to study, work or retire in any EU country. As an EU national, for employment, social security and tax purposes, every EU country is required to treat you exactly the same as its own citizens.

- Euro used by over 340 million EU citizens,
- Telephone & digital services at no extra cost across the EU.

 - Human dignity

Human dignity is inviolable. It must be respected, protected and constitutes the real basis of fundamental rights.

Freedom

Freedom of movement gives citizens the right to move and reside freely within the Union. Individual freedoms such as respect for private life, freedom of thought, religion, assembly, expression and information are protected by the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights.

In June 2019, EU leaders set out their priorities in the 2019-2024 EU strategic agenda. This serves as inspiration for the European Commission's political priorities, which it draws up before taking office for a 5-year term.

The European Council set out 4 priority areas in its 2019-2024 strategic agenda to guide the work of the EU institutions over the next 5 years. These areas seek to respond to the challenges and opportunities that the current global situation has thrown up. By focusing on them, the EU can strengthen its role in today's challenging environment.

The functioning of the EU is founded on representative democracy. A European citizen automatically enjoys political rights. Every adult EU citizen has the right to stand as a candidate and to vote in elections to the European Parliament.

Equality

Equality is about equal rights for all citizens before the law. The principle of equality between women and men underpins all European policies and is the basis for European integration. It applies in all areas. The principle of equal pay for equal work became part of the Treaty of Rome in 1957.

TESTI NON ESTRATTE

The Italian university system is based on three main study cycles to which international students have access.

With the aim of favouring the mobility of international students, the University should run many programmes in English, have a specific fee system and provide scholarships and support, especially for international students.

In particolary, international students are:

- EU students, foreigners resident in Italy,
- Non-EU students resident abroad: all students from countries outside the EU;

10 One of the EU's founding principles is multilingualism.

This policy aims to:

- communicating with its citizens in their own languages
- protecting Europe's rich linguistic diversity
- promoting language learning in Europe

This is a unique approach, unequalled by multilingual countries or international organisations.

Multilingualism is enshrined in the EU's Charter of Fundamental Rights: EU nationals have the right to use any of the 24 official languages to communicate with the EU institutions, and the institutions must reply in the same language.
